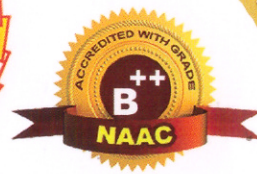

### HISTORY OF HOSPITAL (JMMC & RI) & JUBILEE MISSION COLLEGE OF NURSING

Seventy three years have now rolled on, since the institution came into being in 1952. It was a time when the medical facilities were practically out of reach for most people in Central Kerala. Impelled by the abiding spirit of the healing ministry of Jesus Christ and the awareness of the crying need of the sick and suffering, the Archdiocese of Trichur decided to take up the challenge. Thus, the organisation had a humble beginning on 17<sup>th</sup> December 1951, as a small dispensary. It began as a befitting memorial of the Sacerdotal Silver Jubilee of the late Bishop of Trichur Rt. Rev. Dr. George Alapatt, the first patron of the hospital. In 1952, the hospital started its service with four rooms and 20 beds, two retired part time doctors and two nurses of the Holy Cross Congregation, Sr. Albertina and Sr. Alfrida. This was the first and the only private hospital in Thrissur during the period.

At the time of inception, the hospital functioned in one part of the old building of St. Mary's Minor Seminary, Thope, Thrissur. His Eminence Cardinal N. T. Gilroy of Australia blessed the very first hospital building on 30<sup>th</sup> December 1952 in the presence of Card. V. Gracias. H. E. Martin Lucas SVD, the then Apostolic Internuncio to India inaugurated the institution on 23<sup>rd</sup> April, 1953. On the same year Cardinal Tisserant blessed the first operation theatre. It is 60 years since then that Jubilee Mission Hospital is rendering health care to the sick, irrespective of caste or creed, rich or poor.

The hospital experienced steady growth due to the committed and dedicated service of the doctors, nurses and other staff, the support of the general public and above all by the Divine Providence. Over the years JMMC&RI became

synonym for cleft lip and palate surgery, treatment of snake bite and burns. The hospital opened up new horizons of health care to the common people from different parts of Thrissur, Palakkad and Malappuram with the addition of the super speciality departments of Cardiology and Nephrology in 1998. Other super speciality departments of Urology, Neurology, Neuro Surgery, Endocrinology, Micro Vascular Surgery, Cardio Thoracic Surgery etc. were soon added to the services of the hospital.

The School of Nursing started in the year 1966 and the hospital was recognized by the Medical Council of India (MCI) for internship Training of Doctors (CRRI) in the year 1971. In the year 2003, Jubilee Mission Hospital was recognized as a teaching hospital by the MCI and opened the Medical College. The College of Nursing was also founded in the same year, 2003 with the intake of 50 student. In 2011, MCI permitted the medical college to start PG medical courses. At present twelve specialities run PG courses. 2023 as per INC regulation inspection conducted and permitted to take 60 students.

The College of Nursing is recognized to commence M.Sc. Nursing in four specialities (Medical - Surgical, OBG, Child health and psychiatry) with a total intake of 10 seats and Post Basic Diploma in Cardio-Thoracic Nursing (annual intake of 15 seats) from 2012 onwards. BSc. Nursing 10 seats enhanced in 2023. College of Nursing is recognized as Ph.D Center in the year 2019. 2025 marks a milestone year for the college of nursing, with a significant expansion boosting student intake from 60 to 100, paving the way for more future nursing professionals today.

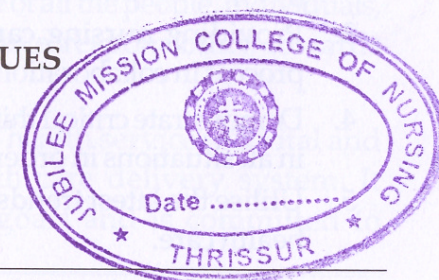

2. Prepare nurses who can make independent decisions in nursing situations, protect the rights of and facilitate individuals and groups in pursuit of health, function in the hospital, community nursing services, and conduct research studies in the area of nursing practice. They are also expected to assume the role of teacher, supervisor, and manager in a clinical/public health setting/college of nursing.

### OBJECTIVES

On completion Nursing program the graduate will be able to :

1. Apply knowledge from physical, biological and behavioural sciences, medical including alternative systems and nursing in providing nursing care to individuals, families and communities.
2. Demonstrate understanding of life style and other factors, which affect health of the individuals and groups.
3. Providing nursing care based on steps of nursing process in collaboration with individuals and groups.
4. Demonstrate critical thinking skill in making decisions in all situations in order to provide quality care.
5. Utilise the latest trends and technology in providing health care.

6. Provide promotive, preventive and restorative health services in line with the National Health Policies and Programmes.

9. Demonstrate skills in teaching to individuals and groups in clinical/community health settings/ College of Nursing.

11. Demonstrate leadership and managerial skills in clinical/community health settings.
12. Conduct need based research studies in various settings and utilize the research findings to improve the quality of care.
13. Demonstrate awareness, interest and contribute towards advancement of self and of the profession.

Nursing programme is broad based education within an academic frame work specifically directed to the development of critical thinking skills, competencies and standards required for practice of professional nursing and midwifery as envisaged in National Health Policy 2017.

The teachers have the responsibility to be role models and create learning environment that enables students to acquire inquiry driven, self directed learning and foster an attitude of life long learning.

Nursing education program prepare its graduates to become exemplary citizen by adhering to code of ethics and professional conduct at all times in fulfilling personal, social and professional obligations so as to respond to national aspirations.

## ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- ◆ Register into AMCSFNCK admission portal [www.amcsfnck.com](http://www.amcsfnck.com) using a valid Email-ID (preferably Gmail ID) after selecting the applicable nursing course (B.Sc or PB.B.Sc or M.Sc).
- ◆ The open merit and category wise rank lists of all applicants will be prepared and published on the website, [www.amcsfnck.com](http://www.amcsfnck.com) on the basis of the total percentage of marks obtained in the core subjects of the qualifying examination.
- ◆ All applicants shall register their college wise/speciality wise choices/ options of priority online after the publication of the rank list at the time of ONLINE OPTION REGISTRATION as per admission schedule in the prospectus.
- ◆ All allotments will be made through common single window online counselling on the basis of the preferential options registered by applicant and his/her merit in the rank list published.
- ◆ Allotment will be notified online only and no personal intimation will be issued.
- ◆ An applicant who receives an online allotment will have to join the respective college within the notified date and time schedule.
- ◆ Spot counselling, allotment and admission in the open merit rank order of applicants will be held to fill up the remaining vacant seats after adequate online allotments, if required.
- ◆ The process of allotment will continue until all the seats are filled.

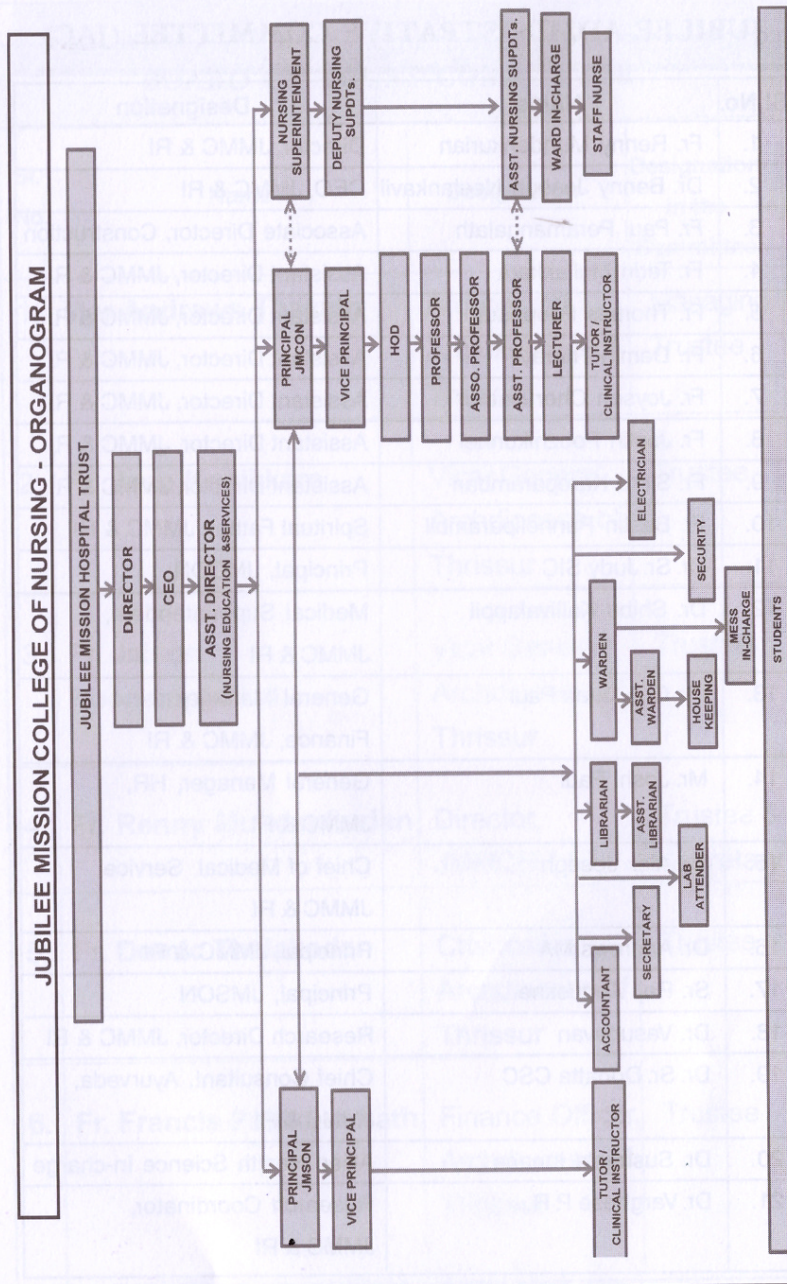

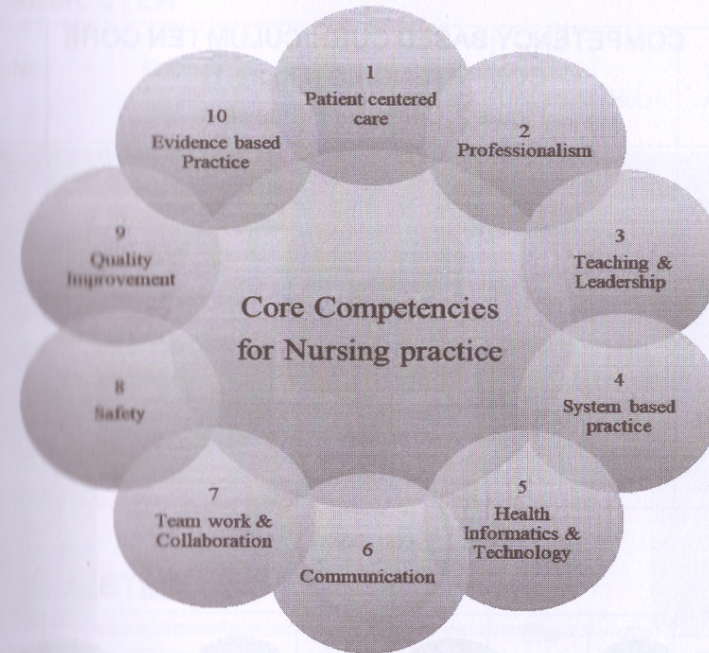


Figure 1. Core Competencies for Nursing and Midwifery Practice by B.Sc. Nursing Graduate {Adapted from NLN Model and Massachusetts: Nurse of the Future - Core Competencies (2016)}

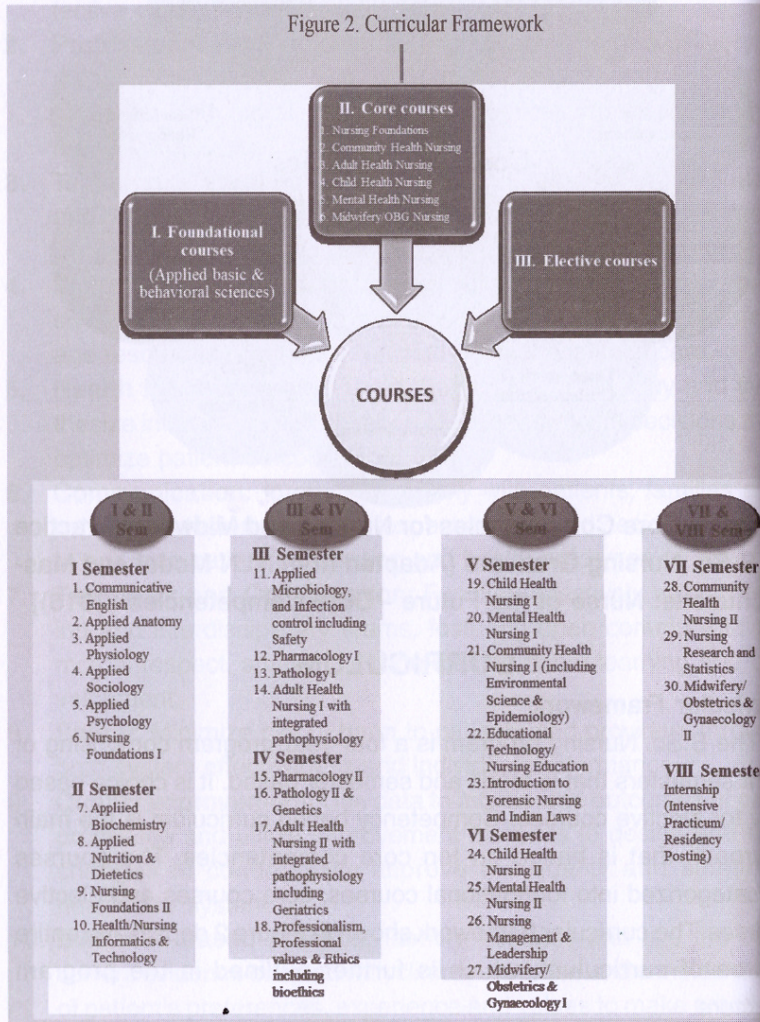
#### Curricular Framework

## CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

**Date of revise : 03.12.2024**

Students have to be punctual for college and clinics. The Morning assembly in theory class days is at 8.20am and the clinical posting days the time for reporting in the clinical area is at 7.30am. Students should be regular in each class hours also.

**Corrective action:** If the students fails to maintain punctuality, oral warning will be given for the first time. If it repeats the written warning (memo) will be issued and if proceeds half day absent will be marked.

Every student must have a minimum of 80% of attendance separately for theory and practicals to be eligible for appearing University Examination.

**Corrective action:** If absent due to unavoidable medical reason/ unanticipated family issues the student will be allowed to compensate to complete the 80% attendance as decided by the disciplinary committee. If the student fails to justify the reason for leave he/she will be withheld from the exams and allowed to appear next exam after making it 80%.

Students are remained absent for the attendance before each lecture, practical class or clinical will be considered as leave. If the leave is not informed priorly is considered as uninformed leave. If the leave was an emergency inform the respective class coordinator on the intimated time (7.30am to 8.20am)

**Corrective action:** If it is an informed leave, that particular day to be compensated for 100% attendance in transcript. In case of uninformed leave 1:2 compensation will be given.(eg: One day uninformed leave student need to compensate that one day + one more day. So total 2 days.)

Students on the role of the college are forbidden to take any active part in political agitation against the authority of the management / government.

- I The student must adhere to the uniform dress code of the institution
- II Wear neat and ironed uniform.
- III Wear ID cards in Clinicals.
- IV Wear black shoes.

**Corrective action:** If any violations are found by faculty or administrative authorities of college and clinics will be reported and corrective action will be taken. Three times oral warning, one explanation letter, fine Rs.100/-, one day suspension

## GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COLLEGE DISCIPLINE

- 1 Students shall maintain proper cleanliness in the college and premises.
- 2 Students are expected to arrive five minutes before the scheduled hour for assembly, class, hospital assignments, etc. A student coming late may be refused admission or deprived of attendance and the same may be reported to the principal, if required.
- 3 Student should not be absent from class, clinical postings, tests, or exams without leave, unless such absence is satisfactorily explained/ informed. The days of leave or absence shall be properly compensated at the end of the course.
- 4 **Leave Policy** - According to the University guidelines. Leave application should state clearly the ground for the application, the number of days and the dates for which leave is required. Mention the place where they are going. Planned leave must be intimated at least 3 days prior to the coordinator. Leave applications shall be forwarded to Principal through proper channels. Those who are extending leave without prior permission need to compensate 1:2 ratio.
- 5 Repeated incidence of absence without authorised leave (absenteeism), will lead to the suspension of student from the college. They may be permitted to the college only after the student along with the guardian makes a written satisfactory explanation to the Principal in this regard.

A student absenting oneself from the college for more than 15 consecutive days without satisfactory written information, is liable to have one's name removed from the rolls.

In case of absence on account of illness, medical leave will be granted on production of medical certificate. Medical leave will not be considered equivalent to attendance. Application for medical leaves shall be submitted to Principal within three days of availing such leave.

The first gate of the college will be closed at 5.00 pm and the second gate at 7.00 pm. Entry will be restricted strictly to the campus after 7.00 pm.

On theory days, students must be ready for the morning assembly by 8.25 am and the assembly will commence at 8.30 am.

On clinical days, all students are expected to be ready by 7.10 am

### LIBRARY RULES AND REGULATIONS

Library Hours: 08.30 am to 06.30 pm on all working days.

Admission to the library is restricted to the students and staff of the institution with proper ID cards.

Members entering the library shall sign in and sign out with student ID Card at the time of entry and departure.

4. Bags and other personal belongings like private books, printed papers, files notebooks, camera, umbrella, cd, lap top, mobile phones, etc. is not allowed inside the library. They shall be kept in the racks provided near the entrance for this purpose. Librarian staff will not be responsible for its safety. Only loose sheets of paper to take notes may be permitted inside the library.
5. Silence shall be maintained strictly in the library. Readers are prohibited from engaging in conversations/discussions as well as from conducting themselves in any manner likely to cause distraction or disturbance for others in subversion of silence maintained in the library .
6. Food/snacks are strictly prohibited inside the library.
7. Library is enabled with wifi connection. The internet facility at the library is strictly for academic purpose alone. Chatting, e-mail, use of pen drives, etc are not permitted. The members making use of the internet facility shall write their name, status, department and time-in and time-out in the separate register kept for the purpose.

#### USE OF LIBRARY

1. **Open Access:** Staff and students will have the privilege of open access to stack room and reading room.
2. **Borrowing Privileges:**
  - i. P.G. students are entitled to borrow TWO books at a time and will be permitted to retain the same for a period not exceeding SEVEN days.
  - ii. U.G. students are entitled to borrow TWO books at a time and will be permitted to retain the same for a period not exceeding FIVE days.
  - iii. The same book can be renewed only once; however, extensions shall not be claimed as a right.

iv. Reference books will be issued to the Faculty members, for a period of 24 hours.

v. CDs, Projects, Dissertations, Periodicals, Journals, Question Banks and bound volumes will not be issued out.

Books on loan with the members can be recalled by the library at any time without notice.

Members shall return all the borrowed items before commencement of vacations, irrespective of the number of days permitted for borrowing.

Members are expected to return the borrowed books on or before the due date. No reminder in this regard will be issued by the Librarian.

Staff / student failing to return the books in time, will face penalty of Rs. 1 per day/ book for 10 days. For the next consecutive 10 days a fine of Rs. 5 per day will be charged. After that a disciplinary action will be taken by the head of the institution on this regard. The fine should be remitted to the library. The librarian shall report to the Principal, if any members fail to return the books even after a stipulated period of fine. The borrowing privileges of such members shall be suspended without notice and disciplinary actions will be initiated on them.

Members are responsible for the safe custody and return of books intact.

- a. Books are to be used with great care. Library labels should not be tampered with. No person shall write upon or make any mark in the books or by any other manner deface or cause damage reducing the value of library books.
- b. Book marks shall be used to avoid dog earing of books.
- c. Any damage of books, if found will be charged/ fined accordingly.

8. Damage or loss of books should be immediately reported to the Librarian. If any book is found damaged on return, the concerned member is liable to compensate for the damage as decided by the Principal. In case of any loss, the cost of replacement of the books will be realized from the member concerned. If the books which are sought to be replaced are not available in the market, an amount equal to double the book value will be realized from the concerned member.
9. If any member loses their student ID card, they should inform the librarian in writing. An alternative arrangement will be made available for them.
10. Members shall take care to switch off the light and fans, when not in use.

### **RULES & REGULATIONS FOR HOSTEL RESIDENTS**

Hostel Warden : Sr. Mariya Antony CHF

The hostel is one's home! How one maintains it depends on how each one of them are living in it. For the purpose of uniformity and orderly functioning of the hostel, a set of rules and regulations are laid down. It is necessary that one take these rules seriously, observe them carefully and contribute to the overall training and moulding behaviour.

All students of St. Damien Hostel shall be present in the hostel before 6 pm, except when they are on duty in the hospital or college.

#### **ROOMS**

Students are always expected to clean their room and maintain it in order. Students are responsible for the furniture provided in their room.

Nails or pins should not be driven into the walls. Fans and lights must be put off when not needed and when leaving the room. All damages to the room or furniture should be promptly reported

to the warden. Concerned students will be charged for all damages caused through carelessness or negligence. Water and electricity are to be used sparingly. Lights in the living rooms should be put off by 10.30 pm.

Students should co-operate to keep the common toilets, bathing rooms, laundry, ironing place, common room etc. clean and tidy. Rooms will be changed once in 6 months or once in a year or as per the need.

#### **STUDY**

Students are not allowed to go into one another's rooms after the night roll call and during study hours. Study is permitted in the rooms only up to 11.00 pm. Students are expected to inform the warden when they need extra time for study.

Washing of clothes and ironing are to be done only in the place provided for the purpose. The concerned students will be charged for all damages caused through carelessness or negligence. Ironing in the hostel is allowed up to 8.30 pm.

Students are expected to be in the study hall & other common places if they want to study after 11.00 pm. There is no combined study after 10.00 pm.

#### **ILLNESS**

Food should not be brought to the rooms from the dining room for oneself or for others. The caretaker / warden will arrange for food if students are ill and are resting in the hostel. Students are expected to inform the warden when they are ill and are not able to go for duty or class.

#### **VALUABLES**

Students are not allowed to keep jewellery, huge amount of cash and other valuables with them in the hostel. The institution does not take responsibility for loss of any valuables or money. The students are not allowed to wear rings, bangles etc. when in uniform and when on duty.

**ATTENDANCE & PRAYER**

- ◆ On theory days, students must be ready for the morning assembly by 8.25 am and the assembly will commence at 8.30 am.
- ◆ On clinical days, all student are excepted to be ready by 7.15 am

All the students are expected to be punctual for the daily roll call and common prayers and class prayers. Catholic students are expected to participate in the daily mass & be punctual for monthly confession & daily rosary.

**VISITING HOURS**

Visitors are permitted only once a week: on Sundays from 2 pm to 5 pm. No visitor is allowed on weekdays without special permission from the warden. All visitors should be met only in the parlour. No one is allowed to take visitors to their living rooms. Visitors shall not meet the students in the hospital or in the college during the clinical hours respectively class hours.

**HOME VISITS**

Hostel inmates are permitted to visit their homes once a month specifically on the second Saturdays and on holidays as decided by the institutions. Inmates leaving the hostel for home visits are expected to be back in the campus before 05.00 pm.

No permission for extension of days of home visits. It will not be entertained over the phone, other than for rare emergencies. If any hostel inmates intend to visit home on occasions other than second Saturdays, permission shall be obtained in advance from the hostel warden submitting a written request countersigned by the parent/guardian, mentioning the emergency specifically.

**SHOPPING**

Hostel inmates are allowed to go out once in a week with friends from the same hostel on Sunday afternoon from 2.00 PM, they should be back in the hostel by 06.00 pm. While going and coming back they

should record their names and time in the hostel movement register. Any other special request will be given due consideration by the warden and permission granted according to the situations.

**MOBILE PHONE POLICY**

Hostel residents are permitted to use mobile phones from 4.30 pm to 10.00 pm on working days, on holidays mobile usage is permitted from 2.00 pm to 10.00 pm. After the permitted time all mobile phones must be handed over to the warden/security personnel by 10.00 pm.

Students who proceed directly home from clinical postings must submit their mobile phones at the Nursing Superintendents office

The same procedure must be followed on the day of return from home before reporting back to clinical duties

Hostel Mobile phone usage timings and submission rules, as mentioned above remain applicable and must be strictly followed

During university examination and on the days university examinations, students are permitted to use mobile phones.

**RAGGING**

Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of the hostel and college. Any individual or collective act of ragging shall be dealt with as per ordinance.

Students are expected to follow the rules of the hostel and failure to do so will lead to disciplinary action.

#### **CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SUPPORT STAFF**

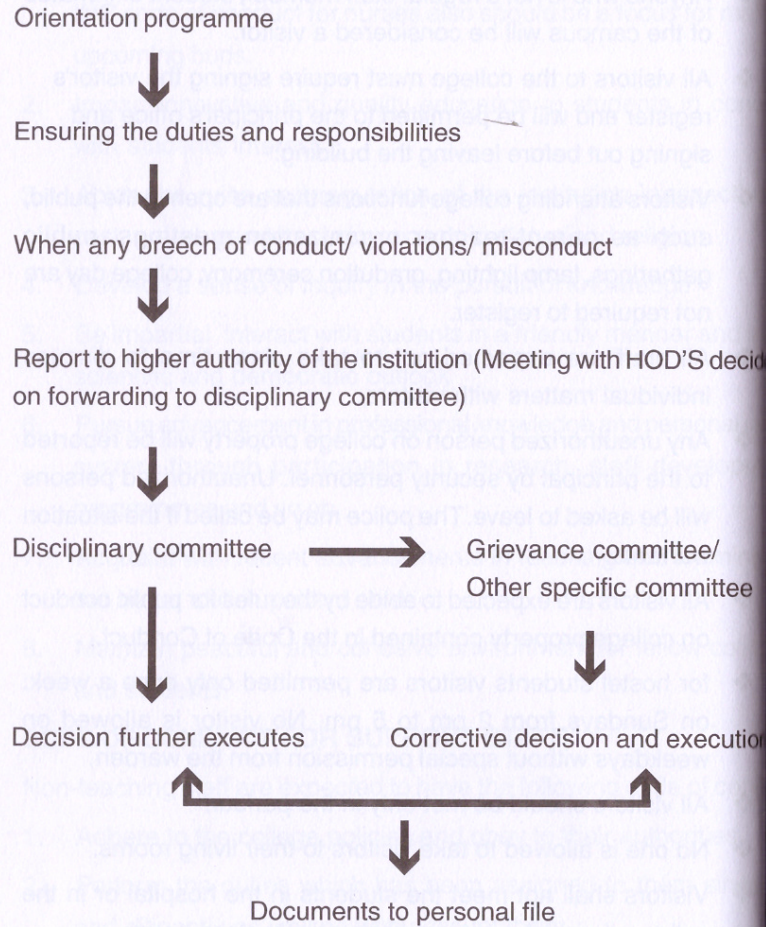
Non-teaching staff are expected to have the following code of conduct

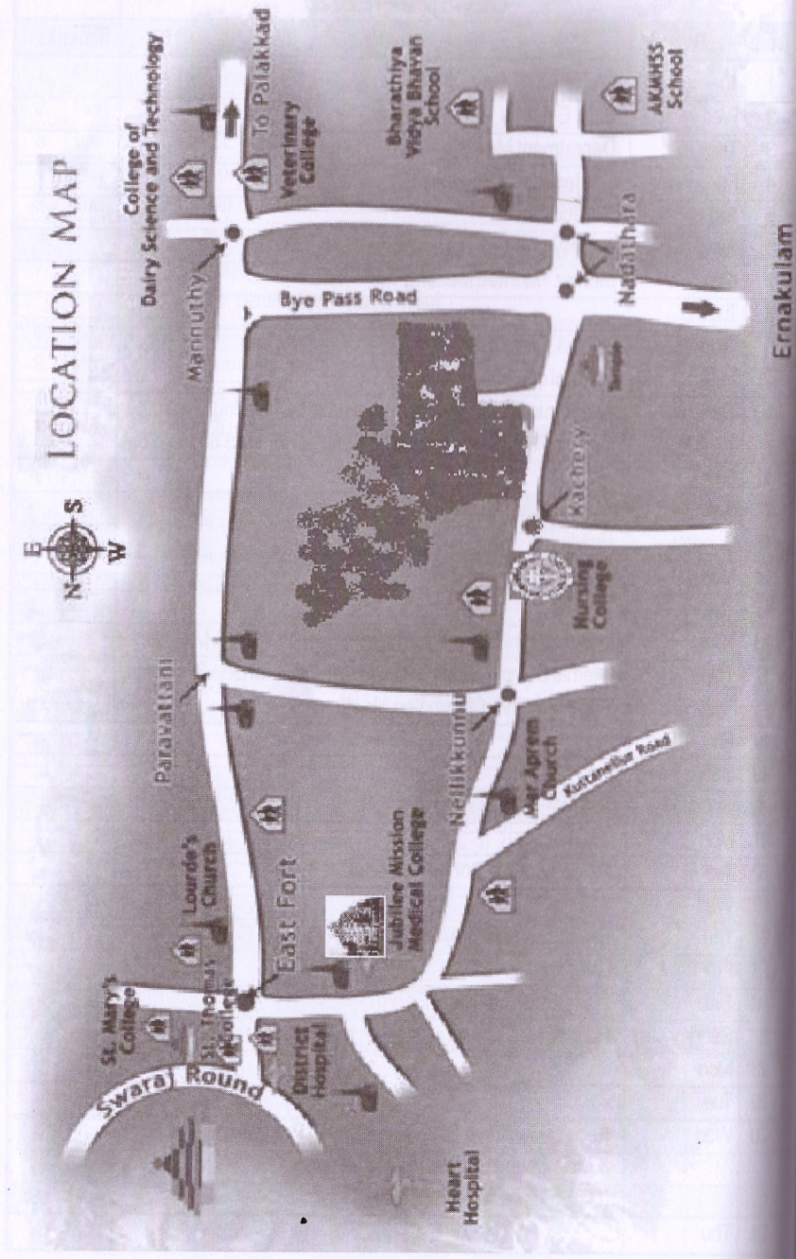

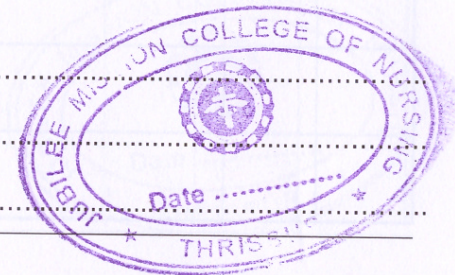
